Job Summary: Teach nursing courses for the College's vibrant and growing nursing programs, including the College's CCNE accredited Baccalaureate Nursing program. Specialization in courses pertaining to Med Surg or Ob/Women's Health. Participate in the formulation of course assignments, accreditation activities, and course and program assessments. Perform other essential departmental functions as assigned by the Nursing Department Chairperson.

Salary and academic rank will be commensurate with experience and educational qualifications.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Prepare and teach College-approved courses in accordance with approved course descriptions and class schedules, including developing syllabi and reading lists and keeping each course taught complete and up to date.
- Respond to and work with multiple constituencies, including students, peers (faculty and staff), and external agencies (business, community, educational, etc.).
- Perform divisional departmental responsibilities by participating in the selection of texts.
- Participation in related teaching resources.
- Possess a proven ability to effectively work with a culturally, linguistically, and ethnically diverse faculty, staff, and students.
- Excellent oral and written communication skills along with strong Information technology literacy skills such as Microsoft Office (Word, Excel, Outlook, Teams, etc.).
- Carry out the essential duties of attendance and participation at convocation, commencement and pinning ceremonies.
- Serve on assigned committees and task forces.
- Attendance and participation at committee, staff, informational and professional meetings. These may involve attendance at evening or weekend events.
- Other teaching and related duties as directed.
- Perform all other duties and responsibilities as assigned.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Master of Science degree in Nursing from an accredited institution of higher education.
- Current, unencumbered New York State RN license, or eligibility to obtain that license.
- At least two (2) years of college teaching experience.
- At least four (4) years of current nursing experience in medical-surgical nursing, Ob/Women's Health, critical care, obstetrics or pediatrics and/or acute rehabilitation nursing.
- Commitment to undergraduate teaching and student-faculty collaborative research.
- Demonstrated ability in teaching, curriculum development and assessment.
- Evidence of effective interpersonal communication skills and ability to work with a diverse college community.
- A deep appreciation for, and understanding of, working in an inclusive, engaging and diverse college.
- Culturally sensitive, caring and friendly with a deep understanding and appreciation of a multi-cultural college community and the Franciscan traditions of St. Francis College.

Preferred Qualifications:

- An earned doctorate in nursing or a related field.
- One or more years of college teaching experience in an Undergraduate Baccalaureate of Nursing program, minimum of 24 credits of teaching.
- Experience with online instruction and delivery methods such as Blackboard, CANVAS or Moodle.
- Experience with curriculum development, and program assessment and evaluation.
- Experience in facilitating high and low-fidelity simulation.
